The critical things you need to know to pass your Troop Eagle Scoutmaster Conference, Troop Board of Review, and District Eagle Board

Fundamentally, the Eagle Rank requires that you have mastered all of the skills that you learned to earn your rank advancement to get to Eagle rank. There are many of these skills, but you should know the skills and knowledge listed below and have this basic knowledge to pass your Eagle reviews.

1. The 7 Scout knots and how to tie each one flawlessly (practice these knots):
 - a. Square knot
 - b. Two half hitches
 - c. Taut-line hitch
 - d. Timber hitch
 - e. Clove hitch
 - f. Bowline
 - g. Sheet bend
2. The skills you needed to know to become a First Class Scout:
 - a. How to find the compass directions at night and during the day without a compass.
 - b. The specific names of 10 native plants found in Montana (weeds do not count).
 - c. When you should use and not use lashings.
 - d. Know and show how to use your Scout neckerchief to make a bandage for a sprained ankle and a sprained shoulder.
 - e. Tell the 5 most common signs of a heart attack.
 - f. Explain the steps in CPR.
 - g. Know the precautions for a safe trip afloat.
3. Also know:
 - a. The names of 10 native Montana mammals (specific names required - "deer" or "squirrel" or "bear" are not acceptable answers).
4. Be able to explain the E.D.G.E. method.
5. Be able to skillfully light a fire with materials you find in the woods under any conditions with just a match, no accelerants or non-native materials allowed.
6. Describe the Scout badge and what the parts of it mean.
7. Know the Scout Oath, Law, Motto, and Slogan.
8. Know the Outdoor Code.
9. Know who Baden Powell was.
10. Know who William D. Boyce was.
11. Justify why you should be approved for Eagle Scout rank.
12. Explain what you can "give back" to the troop once you are an Eagle Scout.
